The idea is simple; children bring in a pound or two and wear their favourite football or sports kit for the day. They then kick, bounce or carry a ball around a playground obstacle course that they've designed with their teachers.





How to send in the money you've raised

By banking slip

- 1. Complete the easy banking slip at the bottom of your letter
- 2. Take the slip and the money to your local bank
- 3. Ask the bank to stamp the box on the letter to confirm the money has been deposited
- 4. Then please send this letter back to Unicef UK using your FREEPOST envelope.

By cheque

- 1. Bank the money you have raised
- 2. Write a cheque for the amount, made payable to Unicef UK
- Fill in the paying in form
- 4. Please send this letter and cheque to Unicef UK using your FREEPOST envelope

After we receive your donation, we'll send you a lovely thank you letter and certificate that you can display at your school. If you'd prefer not to receive this, just let us know.
